NYC Googler Orchestra

The NYC Googler Orchestra was founded in April, 2022 as a volunteer-based organization and is comprised of over 80+ Google employees as well as some external guests.

Since its founding, the orchestra has produced five seasons and performed an array of classical music spanning symphonies, ballets, opera, film scores, and concerti.

The orchestra provides music for the Google and broader NYC communities through several concerts as well as smaller chamber performances throughout the year.

About the Award

The Dr. David Muller Award is an award named for Concerts in Motion's Vice President and founding Board Member Dr. David Muller. It is designed to recognize individuals and groups who volunteer their time and talent to benefit the work of Concerts in Motion.

NYC Googler Orchestra Leadership

Kieran Aulak is the Executive Director of the NYC Googler Orchestra and percussion section leader. He graduated with a Computer Science degree from Case Western Reserve University and a Music degree from the CWRU/Cleveland Institute of Music joint program. Music has played an integral part of Kieran's life from his first piano lesson at age 6. The wind ensemble and drumline leader in high school, Kieran was in the Cleveland Orchestra Youth Orchestra, performing and rehearsing in Severance Hall. In 2018 he won the CWRU concerto competition performing Rosauero's Concerto No. 1 for Marimba. He studied under Matthew Larson and Richard Weiner, principals of West Virginia Symphony Orchestra and Cleveland Orchestra respectively; and has received lessons from Christopher Lamb, Michael Burritt, and Peter Erskine. He has performed all over the world, including tours of China and Turkey. Kieran is currently a Senior SRE at Google and enjoys going to concerts, watching movies, and teaching percussion lessons.

Joshua Chang is the former Executive and Music Director of the NYC Googler Orchestra, leading the orchestra in its first five concert seasons. Joshua graduated with degrees in Computer Science and Conducting from Stanford University in 2021, where he studied with the Gretchen B. Kimball Director of Orchestral Studies, Paul Phillips, and performed with the Stanford Philharmonic. He also served as Music Director for Stanford's largest student theater company in their productions of *The Addams Family* (2019) and *Pippin* (2020). Prior to his conducting career, Joshua played the French horn in various ensembles throughout the country, including the NAFME All-National Band, All-Eastern Orchestra, Principal Horn in the New England Music

Festival Orchestra, Principal Horn in the Connecticut All-State Orchestra, and Principal Horn in the Greater New Haven Youth Orchestra. In 2016, he was selected as an alternate for the National Youth Symphony Orchestra. Joshua is currently a software engineer working on Google Docs.

Matt Dunnam is the Music Director of the NYC Googler Orchestra; the Music Director and Executive Director of the Omnibus Teaching Orchestra; and a composer/arranger with credits in film/TV, games, and orchestral works. Originally from Plainview, New York, Matt has studied composition, cello, classical guitar, and brass. He has studied Composition and Conducting at Hofstra University under Dr. Lowell Boonshaft, at Purchase College Conservatory of Music under Joe Ferry and James MacElwaine, and currently at the Julliard School with Mark Shapiro. As a hornist, Matt played Principal Horn in the Norwalk Youth Syphony, in the NY All-State Orchestra, and most recently in This Too Shall Brass, a Google-based Brass quintet. As a conductor and composer, Matt premiered his piece, Requiem Mass, at the Purchase Conservatory in 2009.

Rachel Krahn has been studying cello since the age of 4. She is currently the Principal Cellist of the NYC Googler Orchestra, and Cellist in the Googler String Quartet. She was also an inaugural member of the original West Coast Googler Orchestra, as Principal / Asst. Principal (2014-2019.) She has performed with a number of orchestras and ensembles, including the Florida West Coast Youth Philharmonic as Principal Cellist (2003-2007), Florida All-State Orchestra (2002-2006), the Baroque Orchestra of New Jersey as Assistant Principal (2000-2002), and multiple pit orchestras for national musical theater and opera productions. She studied Vocal and Theater Performance at AMDA, and later Industrial and Labor Relations at Cornell University.

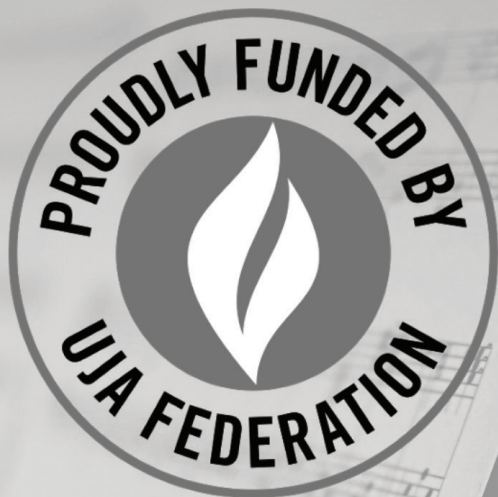
